

About INsPIRE

The overarching goal of INsPIRE is to support, through the cooperation of European institutions, the rebuilding, modernization, and internationalization of the governance system of higher education institutions (HEIs) in Iraq with a specific focus on planning and programming systems. Due to the recent crisis and political economic situation, the current higher education system requires a strong intervention to face the weakness of the existing governance system. To institutionalize good governance practices in Iraqi HEIs, which also means enforcing institutional values such as autonomy, accountability, participation, and internationalization, as well as implementing well-structured management systems, will contribute to the development of Iraqi HIEs helping them to meet the international standards.

The aim of the project is to support HEIs in Iraq in order to make them capable of establishing a modern governance framework through the adoption of innovative practices. The **specific objectives** of INsPIRE are the following:

- Enhancing good governance, management and accountability practices in the HEIs
- Establishing a clear governance framework, including well-defined and clear mission and goals through the definition and implementation of action plans
- Strengthening the international relations management within the HEIs
- Improving participation in strategic planning and development activities for non-university actors and non-state actors

Training week on Internationalisation Strategies hosted by the University of Bologna

On **May 16th to 20th**, staff members from 10 Iraqi universities together with the representatives of the Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research in Iraq have been hosted by the **University of Bologna**, Italy, for an intensive **Training Week "Design internationalisation plans for universities"** to jointly work on strategic planning for internationalisation activities.

The Training Week saw the participation of **24 Iraqi colleagues**, among the staff in charge of identifying policies and priorities dealing with internationalisation at the highest university level (Rectors and Vice-Rectors), Directors of Cultural or international relation Divisions, and staff at the MOHESR advising and supporting internationalisation activities of HEIs, dealing with national internationalisation policies frameworks, agreements, scholarships, etc.

The training aimed at strengthening the capacities of Iraqi universities in terms of internationalisation, and strategic planning of their future activities linked to international cooperation agreements. The training was also **an opportunity for the partners to meet again**, after a very long period of distance working, and carefully plan the remaining activities of the final INSPIRE year of work before the closure of the project, as well as to think together about future sustainability actions. Partners could finally enjoy sitting in the same room, exchange and discuss, as well as **share some good laughs**.

The main key message of the Training Week was to encourage universities to exploit their own strengths, being aware of the challenges and weaknesses, with the result of being successful – strategically – through **the definition of objectives which are relevant but also manageable, ambitious but also feasible**. The week included a set of presentations, but also practical activities and working groups to support theoretical learning as well as learning by doing.

The Bologna meeting was also an arena for the Iraqi universities to dialogue with the European colleagues, taking inspiration from their experiences, and to **dialogue with the representatives of the Iraqi Ministry**, to support a change at both institutional and national level and to drive a new Agenda for Higher Education in the country.



Preparatory activities



Suggested preparatory activities and readings for the preparation of the training event in Bologna

Dear partners,

in order to optimize the training period in Bologna, I would ask you if you can collect preliminary information of your institutions that may be useful to carry out the SWOT analysis and then a preliminary version of your university plan for internationalisation during your stay in Bologna.

We do not need precise and detailed figures and we do not need these information in advance, but it is important that you come to Bologna with a solid knowledge of the state of the art of your institution in relation to the main internationalisation dimensions.

So, we do not need any preliminary written data work but just that you have an idea of the following issues regarding your institution (please ignore those that are not applicable or relevant for you):

- 1) Any relevant governmental policies towards internationalisation in higher education in your country
- 2) Any relevant constraints towards internationalisation in higher education at national level
- 3) history of internationalisation efforts in your institution
- 4) key data on the following items: student enrolment, number of faculty and department, percentage of international students and staff, etc.)
- 5) data on internal budget support for internationalisation and main types of expenditures
- 6) The range of collaborative agreements with foreign partner institutions for education and research. Membership of other networks. Any concentration in specific regions/countries
- 7) number of incoming and outgoing students and main destinations
- 8) number of PhD/Master students abroad that are committed to come back to your institution at the end of the mobility
- 9) degree of participation of your institution in any international programmes
- 10) existence of a foreign language learning center and availability of staff and courses for the university population
- 11) Research collaboration: fund acquisition; research consortia; international conferences; international research standing; research-teaching links.
- 12) Specific services and infrastructure exist to support and develop international activities

In addition, please consider the following readings that can give some preliminary insights on the debate over university plan for internationalisation. I have to say that most of the literature refer to Anglo- western models of internationalisation with few spaces for other visions and approaches. We will discuss about it during the training in Bologna. For the time being, please consider the following:

1)<u>A Global View of Internationalisation: What Next?</u> (only preliminary chapters available for free)

An attempt to suggest differentiated local and regional responses for university internationalisation according to geographical variation in social and economic needs. Also a suggestion to associate internationalisation and SDG's policies at university level





2) Is internationalisation creating inequality in higher education?

A comparative analysis from the 5th Global Survey on Internationalization of Higher Education, conducted by the International Association of Universities (IAU)

3) The Internationalisation of Higher Education in the Mediterranean

A comparative work focusing on current and prospective trends of 10 Mediterranean countries in terms of university internationalisation, including some Middle East countries. SWOT analysis at country level is included



Welcome to Bologna!

The University of Bologna welcomes you to our city! Bologna is called the Red (for the colour of its buildings), the Fat (for its good cuisine and delicious typical dishes) and the Learned (because of the long traditions of the University of Bologna). We hope you will have a good and safe trip and wish you a pleasant stay in Bologna.

Bologna in May

Springtime is the best period of the year in Bologna, the perceived temperature is usually warm, not too hot neither cold. The temperatures during your stay are expected to be between 15 and 25 degrees. It is a period of the year usually warm, but it could also rain so it is also advisable to always have an umbrella to be on the safe side.

Event Details

Partners Meeting and Training week "Design internationalisation plans for universities", hosted by the University of Bologna from 16th to 20th of May 2022.

Pick up from Bologna Airport

At your arrival at the Bologna airport, please follow the sign for TAXI. There will be a person from UNIBO to welcome you, just look for someone carrying a "**INSPIRE/University of Bologna**" sign. Travellers will be given a CODE for the taxi drivers, so that the ride is charged directly to UNIMED.

Meeting point

Since the group is staying in two different Hotels (due to the availability of rooms), it has been agreed that the **meeting point** to reach the Training Venue will be in front of the **Hotel Internazionale.** A UNIBO student will come to pick the group at **8.30** in the morning and will escort you to the meeting location.

Meals

Lunches and coffee breaks are organized at the training venue.

Dinner on 15/05 is organized at the Hotel Internazionale at 20.00 to welcome our Iraqi colleagues.

Dinner on 16/05 is organized at Pizzium (via Giuglielmo Oberdan n.30) to enjoy a fun pizza night. We will walk together to the place from the Hotel, meeting time will be at 19.45 at the Hotel Lobby.

The remaining dinners are free. UNIMED will be providing all travellers with an envelope with a fixed amount to cover the costs of the free dinners. The amount is calculated taking into account the project budget at disposal.





Accommodation

All **Iraqi Partners** will stay at the **Hotel Internazionale** which is located in a central area of the city, just few steps away from the main square Piazza Maggiore and the train station. 


Due to the unavailability of rooms, **European Partners** will stay at the **Zanhotel Tre Vecchi**.

Meeting Location (16th May – first day)




The meeting on the first day will be held at the **Rettorato** of University of Bologna.

As you can see from the map, you can easily reach the Rettorato by foot. A UNIBO student will escort you to the place, but just in case here is the route from Hotel Internazionale to the Rettorato (Via Zamboni, 33).

Once you go out from the hotel turn right on Via Irnerio (you will recognise it because it is one of the main streets of Bologna). Keep walking straight for about 9 minutes and turn right when you reach Via Antonio Bertoloni.

Continue walking onto Piazza Scaravilli. It is a small square with white benches where you will also find the University of Bologna Faculty of Economics. In front of the square, you will find the Rettorato in Via Zamboni 33 (please see the picture of the entrance in the upper left-hand corner of this page).

Training Location (17th, 18th, 19th, 20th May)




For the remaining days the training will be held in a different location at Aule Belmeloro.

Once you go out from the hotel turn right on Via Irnerio. Keep walking straight for about 9 minutes and turn right when you reach Via Antonio Bertoloni. Continue walking onto

Piazza Scaravilli. In front of Piazza Scaravilli you will see Via Zamboni. Turn right and then take the first street on your left which is called Via Largo Alfredo Trombetti. Keep going straight for about 250 meters and Aule Belmeloro will be on your left (the entrance is showed in the picture in the upper-left corner of this page).
